

Geography/Environmental Studies Minor

*To declare this Minor, students must complete ONE (1) Geography course at UCLA (grade C or better)

*All courses must be taken for a letter grade; minimum GPA of 2.0 required in the Minor

*GEOG 191 (Variable Topics) may count towards the major. For which category, contact the Academic Counselor.

*One Independent Research class (Geog 199) may apply towards the Minor. **Must be taken as a 4-unit, letter-graded course.**

*At least 20 units applied toward this Minor must only count towards this Minor and may not overlap with any other major or minor

*No more than 2 upper division courses may overlap between the student's major and this Minor
